

Early Years Pupil Premium 2023 - 2024

Spend and Rationale

All children at Brunswick Nursery School receive personalised provision and support, by having access to experienced and highly trained staff who create an early years curriculum which is constantly under review and has been designed to offer the maximum flexibility to meet the needs of the children. Staff meet regularly to share, review and plan for children's progress.

Once we have been notified that a child is eligible for Early Years Pupil Premium we will arrange to meet with parents to discuss the needs of their child. We attempt to be as creative and flexible in our approach to supporting children's learning. Consultations were also carried out with parents to identify any specific areas for focus or support for EYPP children. Individualising EYPP spending is particularly important due to the low numbers of eligible children.
